# President's Perspective



I would like to welcome everyone back from a very hot summer vacation, and I hope that you are ready to hit the ground running as we embark on another successful League year. As in the past, with the launch of a new League year comes a new committee placement for our active members, the launch of a Provisional class, and the opportunity to learn from the enduring wisdom of our Sustaining members. New placement assignments challenge us to learn and hone fresh skills, define our own communication styles, and connect with new friends.

Our League's focus area is Project GREEN: Using Nature to Nurture. From our focus, we can learn many valuable lessons, including the idea that you reap what you sow. The key to a successful placement centers on defining your expectations for this League year and making them happen, regardless of whether you received your first, second, or third committee choice. Some of my most rewarding and memorable JLP experiences derived from my willingness to venture out of my comfort zone and attempt something new. ## President's Report

With the shift in the role of the JLP Board from management to governance, we can expand our community reach, presence, and visibility in Philadelphia. This is leading the JLP into exciting, uncharted territory. We need to sustain our relevance in the community and respond to the constant state of change. The need to become issue-based rather than project-based in our strategic direction is the foundation of our mission and will help us chart our own course and lead to greater member satisfaction and longevity.

With this in mind, I reached out to Mayor Michael Nutter's office in an effort to forge relationships and find common ground in programming and initiatives. I, along with other members of the Board, met with the Mayor's staff several times this summer and uncovered many synergies and opportunities for partnership and collaboration. The City of Philadelphia was named among the first recipients of the Cities of Service Leadership Grant provided by Cities of Service and the Rockefeller Foundation. As one of ten winning cities, Philadelphia was able to hire a Chief Service Officer through funding received from the Rockefeller Foundation. This new position is dedicated to engaging more Philadelphians in service and channeling volunteers towards the City's most pressing issues. A citywide service plan is being developed that will include designs for a website that will make it easier for Philadelphians to get involved in both 'one-time' and ongoing volunteer opportunities organized by the City as well as by a network of nonprofit organizations.

We participated in the launch of the Summer of Service Challenge on July 27 at Lemon Hill in Fairmount Park, which was part of the City's Initiative "Let's Read. Let's Move. Philadelphia." Along with Riverbend Environmental Education Center, we sponsored a live animal exhibit and worm composting activity for children. Other organizations participating in this event included Students Run Philly Style, Teens4Good, the Mural Arts Program, First Book, YouthBuild Philadelphia Charter School, and EducationWorks. It was a huge success! We look forward to many more interactive events in the future. Please be on the lookout for upcoming events and Mission Credit opportunities associated with the Mayor's initiatives in upcoming e-Lines.

# New "No-Show" Policy for Mission Credit Opportunities

Please be respectful of fellow JLP members and of our organization's reputation in the community. JLP members spend a considerable amount of time planning and implementing Mission Credit opportunities, many of which have a direct impact on the community we serve. Community committees rely on adequate staffing to provide successful events and to foster and maintain positive relationships with our community partners. Similarly, the JLP pays for speakers, materials, catering, and rental space for training events; therefore, achieving an accurate headcount is essential. Your consideration and cooperation are greatly appreciated.

If you are unable to attend a Mission Credit opportunity (whether a community project or a JLP training) for which you are registered, you must cancel your reservation online **at least 48 hours in advance** to allow another member the opportunity to attend. If you need to cancel in the event of an emergency, and the online reservation system is no longer available, please notify the event organizer prior to the start of the event.

A member is allowed to miss one Mission Credit opportunity for which she is registered. **If a member registers for and misses a second Mission Credit opportunity within one League year, she will be responsible for paying a \$25 fine to the League.** If the member is able to find a replacement to attend in her place, she will not owe a fine. *(Note: It is the member's responsibility to ensure that the event organizer and the Registrar are aware that a replacement attended.)* In addition, the member must communicate with the event organizer prior to the start of the event that she will not be attending. No fine will be assessed if a member cancels her reservation online at least 48 hours prior to the start of the event, as outlined above. **J**
