The Membership Development Council is seeking “Angels” who have extra quota to assist current Provisional and active members who lack items for their JLP Thrift Shop quota requirement in order to remain in good standing. If you, or someone you know, possesses eligible items that would like to offer as quota to a member in need, please email Jennifer Morgan, VP of Membership Development, at jagutmaker@aol.com no later than April 20. The “Angel” will receive tax credit for the quota donation.

Provisional and active members who need assistance in securing items that may count towards their JLP Thrift Shop quota requirement should contact Jennifer Morgan no later than April 20. There is no guarantee that items will amount to the equivalent of full Provisional (\$100) or active (\$125) quota or that a match can be secured, as this is a voluntary and informal service dependent upon member participation. It is the sole responsibility of the recipient to arrange a pick-up of the items and to hang and tag them at the JLP Thrift Shop.

Priority is given to Provisionals and transfers and is made on a rolling basis through April 30.
